Dear Parishioners and Friends,

As we celebrate Christmas once again, I want to extend warm and prayerful greetings to all in our parish communities of Monasterboice & Togher.

Christmas centres us on a simple, astonishing truth — **Emmanuel** — **God is with us**. Not as a distant idea, but as a child born into ordinary life. God steps fully into our hopes and worries, our joys and our grief. He knows what it is to be human — because He has lived it.

Like our own homes, the parish adapts so it can serve into the future. Buildings may change — but the heart of parish life remains faith, welcome and community.

So this Christmas, may we rediscover that God's love has entered our world — and will not leave it. **Presence matters more than presents**. Relationship more than perfection. And — like George Bailey — may we realise our lives truly matter to God. If this Christmas is difficult for you, you are especially remembered in prayer. And if faith feels distant, please know you still belong here. Nobody is beyond the reach of the Christ-child.

May Christ bring peace to your homes and hope to your hearts. Thank you for the friendship and kindness that I meet so often in parish life. Thanks also to the **many** volunteers in our different ministries who do such a wonderful job in serving the various needs of our parishes with much enthusiasm and commitment.
